Since 1959, Genny Smith's *Mammoth Lakes Sierra* has been a favorite guidebook among travelers. This must-have book is also replete with illustrations of the region's geology and wildlife, plants, and trees, and contains pages of stunning photographs capturing the area's overwhelming beauty, spectacular scenery, and amazing terrain. Genny Smith and her team of experts help readers understand the full story of the eastern Sierra around Mammoth Lakes—its amazing terrain, its spectacular weather, its amazing diversity of plant and animal life, as well as the history of the people who found this place to be as wonderful centuries ago as contemporary visitors do today. What's made a seventh edition necessary? Many, many changes have occurred during the last nine years. New and better maps and books are widely available. Some wildflowers have new names, based on the recently published *Jepson Manual*. We've added telephone numbers and websites, for quicker access to sources of information. We've redrawn maps to make them clearer, and explained the reason why trees near Horseshoe Lake have been dying since 1990. We've included information on the new restrictions on cars going beyond Minaret Summit, and summed up what we hope is the end of the controversy over Mono Lake. A new and enhanced index makes access to the book's information easier for the reader.
